+WHAT IS IT?

The Recovery Voucher Program is a direct service program by United Way of Wayne County (UWWC) geared towards assisting individuals and families in their recovery/transition from natural disasters or personal crises like domestic violence, eviction, and re-entry by providing a voucher. These vouchers can be used at thrift stores where quality clothing, furniture, home supplies, and building materials may be purchased at affordable prices. This partnership also allows us to provide additional support to local nonprofits.



ENVSC WELCOME HOME KITS

Many veterans moving from the street or a shelter enter their new homes with nothing. Elks can help by providing Welcome Home Kits of needed supplies to help these veterans establish their homes.

Generally, a kit will include kitchen, bathroom, bedroom, and cleaning supplies, items like bedding, dishes, pots, pans, towels, toiletries, cleaning supplies, laundry baskets & detergent, etc. However, a kit may not include just one or two items. Lodges are encouraged to work with individual veterans to coordinate kit supplies. For example, some veterans may prefer a coffee maker to a crockpot, or a toaster oven to a microwave.

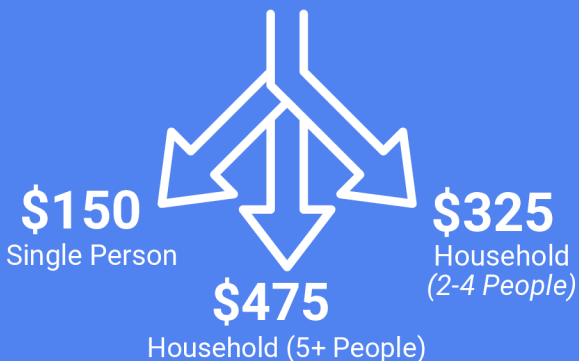

+ABOUT THE VOUCHERS

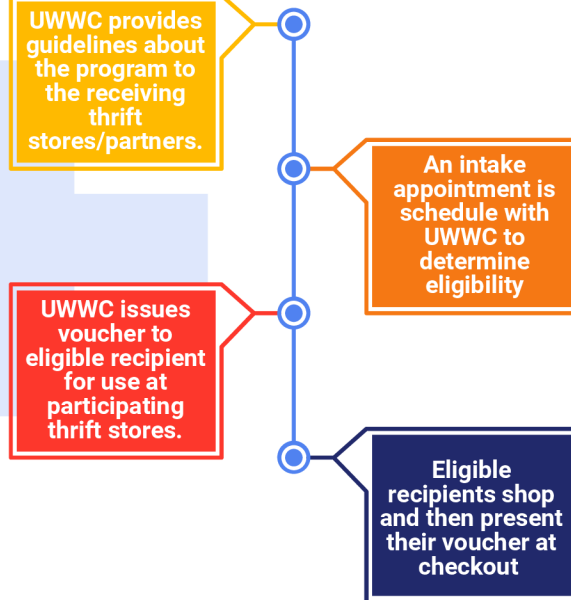
The voucher program funds come from various grants and potentially from campaign fund designations/allocations and will be available to eligible recipients as funds allow. Vouchers will expire fourteen (14) days from the issue date. If not used within the time, it will be voided.

Vouchers will be issued in the following amounts:



+HOW IT WORKS

All potential recipients must undergo an intake process to determine their eligibility and must provide proof of income, photo identification, and transition documents.



+REFERRALS

Referrals can come from a community partner or other UWWC-verified partner (for example, UNC Healthcare or Wayne County Public Schools). Agencies making referrals should submit the referral through **NCCARES360** or contacting UWWC by **phone or email**. Referring agencies involved in the client's transition process must provide a referral letter.
